Over a year ago AACAA acquired a complete and comprehensive A&P Mechanic Program from Tim Glubaskas, the Director of Maintenance at Warbelow Air. Tim's program is a solid standalone program that eloquently satisfies the requirements AACAA member mechanic helpers require to earn an A&P Mechanic license.

To facilitate your A&P Mechanic Helpers to complete a program and become licensed, AACAA can track your mechanic helper progress through monthly OJL and RTI time cards, assist with mechanic helpers obtaining tools and winter gear through ADOL, and identify books and other learning guides. Lastly, once the mechanic helper has completed the requirements of the program, AACAA will award them with a certification of completion.

To initiate and complete tracking for the A & P Mechanic Helper the following forms are needed:

1. Application Form
2. A & P Mechanic Helper Program Agreement
3. General Training Matrix – OJL
4. General Training Matrix – RTI
5. Career Support and Training Services Form (Assistance for tools & winter gear)

Meanwhile, AACAA will meet with the University of Alaska team and seek a waiver for requirements to allow your mechanic helper to enroll in courses at the University. In addition, AACAA will check in with the University on program toward creating an on-line course similar to the classes at Embry Riddle Aeronautical University.

AACAA will continue to meet with a group of employers, a Training Action Committee (TAC), to periodically assess and provide information for the betterment of the A & P Mechanic Program.
